CGSC is a Not-for-Profit Organization, registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. The Council has been promoted by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) and Department of Heavy Industries (DHI), Government of India, under the aegis of Ministry of Skills Development and entrepreneurship with financial support by National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC).

**“The key objective of the CGSC is to create a robust and vibrant eco-system for quality education and skill development in the Capital Goods Sector in the country.”**

The Skill Council has been set up to develop a skilling eco-system for the Capital Goods Sector. While doing so the Skill Council developed a comprehensive Occupational Map of the sector comprising of 269 job roles across different industry shop floors. To start with, 55 qualifications comprising of 203 National Occupational Standards, validated by the industry experts and aligned to the National Skill Qualification Framework have been rolled out.

More than 800 training centres across 20 states are currently delivering training on CGSC qualifications. Over 1 lakh students have been enrolled and over 60,000 certified with a placement rate of apprx. 67% in occupations of Machining ( CNC Operator - Vertical Machining Centre, CNC Operator Turning etc), Welding ( MMAW/SMAW, MIG MAG or GMAW etc), Designing ( CNC Programmer, Draughtsman Mechanical etc) & Fitters ( Fitter Fabrication, Fitter Mechanical Assembly etc).

Capital Goods Skill Council in addition has 6 Transnational qualification aligned to the UK standards.

The focus is now steadily shifting to developing qualification aligned to Industry 4.0.

In 2017, CGSC was awarded two awards, Best Sector Skill Council & Best Sector Skill Council – Standards & QA.

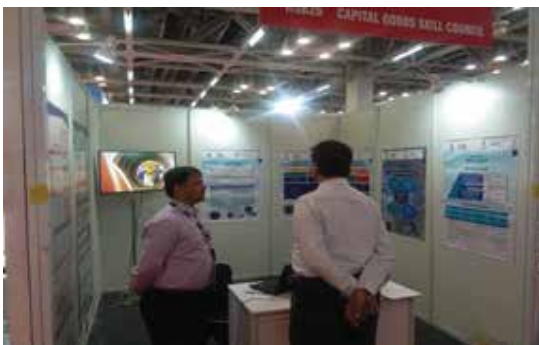
## GLOBAL SKILL SUMMIT 2019
